Sociodemographic PORTRAIT of VERDUN and Toujours ensemble 404THS

Verdun's economy and demographics are growing, and this social change has led to heterogeneous neighbourhoods in which households with a very high revenue can be found alongside those under the poverty line. The work of Toujours ensemble is crucial to meet the varied needs of Verdun residents who have family, academic, social or cultural vulnerabilities.

SNAPSHOT of the territory*

POPULATION:

69,229 people live in the borough. Population growth of 4.6% between 2011 and 2016.

ABOUT VERDUN FAMILIES

- Families with children represent **55%** of the population. The borough has **9,765 families** with children, including 6,375 two-parent families (65%) and 3,390 single-parent families (35%) (32.5% on the Island of Montreal).
- Quick fact: The number of single-parent families saw a significant decrease of 6.6% during this period (2011 to 2016).
- Verdun welcomed **500 new families with children** between 2001 and 2016.

IMMIGRANT POPULATION

- Immigrants represent **24**% of the borough population (34% on the Island of Montreal).
- 23% of these immigrants are between the ages of 0 to 14 years (24% on the Island of Montreal).
- **30**% are new immigrants (22% on the Island of Montreal) and **9**% are refugees (15% on the Island of Montreal).

OTHER DEMOGRAPHICS

- Young people (ages 0 to 14) represent **14**% of the population (15.8% on the Island of Montreal).
- 21% of the population identifies as a visible minority (33% on the Island of Montreal).

EDUCATION LEVEL, INCOME, AND UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

- Exit rates without a diploma or qualification at the secondary level: **26.4%** (20.76% on the Island of Montreal).**
- 18% of people in **households have a low income** (18% on the Island of Montreal). Out of the 11,830 people in this situation, 2,120 young people live in a low-income household, which represents **19.1**% of people aged **0 to 17** (17% for the Island of Montreal).
- The majority of households have only one source of financial support: Out of the 33,995 households in the borough, 22,825 (67%) have only one person who financially supports the family.
- People aged 15 and over are unemployed at a rate of 8.1% (9% on the Island of Montreal).

Since its inception, the team has provided to all the young people in the community an environment that lets them develop their full potential. Parcours provides a **unique**, **friendly**, and **safe space** that young people can call their **second home**.







The Parcours PROGRAM INCLUDES:

- Extra-curricular activities and various projects (cooking, performing arts, sports, travel, gala, etc.)
- Homework assistance (access to a library and computers)
- Affordable **monthly outings** (horse-back riding, tobogganing, sugar shack)
- **Annual camps** (in the fall and during March break)
- A summer program with a day camp and free activity service in parks for youths aged 8 to 12 and a camp for teens aged 13 to 17

Students in the **Passeport pour ma réussite** Program and the **Sac à dos** Program have access to activities in the Parcours Program.

A typical day IN THE PARCOURS PROGRAM:

Every week day after school, students come to Toujours ensemble starting at 3:00 p.m.

Once they pass through the front door, they say hello to everyone and eat a snack provided by Te. They then get together with their friends and find the youth worker who works with them. They often go to the homework assistance room to start their lessons, or they settle into one of the couches in the library to read a book.

At 4:00 p.m., they can join a fun and educational workshop on a topic such as science, cooking, sports, computers or art. These workshops focus on discovery, cooperation and personal excellence to help the students develop their social skills, self-knowledge and independence. This helps them gain responsibility for the choices they make.

At 5:30 p.m., the activities end, but evening workshops are available so that everyone can socialize and get to know each other better.

Every day, the team works with these youths to help them thrive, get involved, shape their personalities, and persevere, all with the goal of helping them become socially engaged.

General Objective:

CONTRIBUTE TO THE ACADEMIC **SUCCESS OF YOUTH**

The Sac à dos team helps primary students in different areas of their academic and personal lives to help them reach their full potential.

The program is run at two schools in Verdun: École Lévis-Sauvé and École Chanoine-Joseph-Théorêt. The program creates a close collaboration between youth workers, teachers, school staff and parents. This reflects the team's primary "school-family-community" approach.

Each student registered in the program receives a personalized action plan. The idea is to help each youth work on specific academic, personal or social objectives. The second facet of our approach is based on needs: through daily activities, the Te staff implements measures so that each student can reach their goals.

The students also interact through different activities (fun and educational workshop, reading workshop, school support), and this group focus is the third principle that guides the team. The group approach also helps students develop or reinforce their social skills, fosters mutual support, and lets them develop a sense of belonging.

FOR THE 53 students who were enrolled **IN THE 2016-2017 SCHOOL YEAR:**

RESULTS

All of the students who finished Grade Six (16) went on to high school, and 13 were put in a regular class.

- 10 of the 12 students with access to the Passeport pour ma réussite Program enrolled in this program.
- The team produced **53 action plans** with educational or personal goals. Out of these goals, 45% were achieved and 49% are being achieved.
- The team created **5 projects** over several weeks to get youths involved and help them experience success.

THE TEAM ORGANIZED:

- 7 workshops on teamwork
- 3 workshops on emotion management
- 3 workshops on communication
- 2 workshops on social awareness
- 2 workshops on self-esteem

The team also ran about a dozen workshops on sports, arts, improv, and science that focused on things like developing creativity, creating a sense of belonging, and managing stress.

IMPACTS

SOCIAL SKILLS

- 87% say they have more tools to find resources when they feel sad or are having problems.
- 66% say they are able to listen to and consider other people's ideas.

• 92% say that they are more interested in reading. They also say that they go to the library outside of class time more often.

MOTIVATION

• 79 % of students say that they are more motivated and that they better understand the importance of going to school. Motivation was improved even more among Grade 5 and 6 students.

NEW PARTNERSHIP

In January 2018, the Sac à dos team started a pilot project with the École Notre-Dame-de-Lourdes. The goal of the pilot phase was to find the optimal conditions to offer the Sac à dos Program to students at this school. The activities were held at the Centre de persévérance scolaire Marcelle et Jean Coutu at the Te offices. Teachers and school staff worked with Te youth workers members throughout the project. Twelve students in primary cycles 2 and 3 were followed two days a week. The pilot project ran over 20 weeks between January and June 2018.

The pilot project was made possible thanks to support from Montreal Hooked on School and Ms. Isabelle Melançon, MNA for Verdun, Minister of Sustainable Development, the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change.

Passeport pour ma réussite Program

Toujours ensemble has run the Passeport pour ma réussite Program in partnership with Pathways to Education Canada, Passeport pour ma réussite Québec, and the Verdun community since 2007.

Four types of EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT:

SOCIAL SUPPORT (MENTORING)

- Diverse workshops co-led by passionate volunteers who combine creativity with hands-on skills (e.g., crocheting, bike repair, cooking).
- Through individual and group coaching, visits to companies and educational
 institutions as well as workshops (e.g., in financial management, CV writing,
 negotiations, and entrepreneurship) with the Boston Consulting Group, the
 students develop self-knowledge and employability skills that will help
 them both in school and with their careers.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT (TUTORING)

• Dedicated and inspired volunteers help students with their general education and with school.

MENTORING SUPPORT

- A team of four Student-Parent Support Worker (SPSW) provide guidance to these young people throughout their academic careers and evaluate their needs.
- Focus on creating and maintaining ties between the school, family and student.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

- Varied types of ad hoc support throughout the year to reduce the financial barriers to education (e.g., monthly public transit passes and school uniforms).
- Students can also accumulate a high-school bursary of up to \$2,000, depending on how many years they participate in the program.

General Objectives:

- 1 Increase the high school graduation rate
 - 2 Increase access to post-secondary studies



Overall, \$ 54 550 has been given out in bursaries over the last five years, including the grads of 2017-2018.

This year, PASSEPORT POUR MA RÉUSSITE HAD:

- 207 students
- 18 partner secondary schools
 - > 75 % of students from the École Monseigneur-Richard secondary school in Verdun
- **25 students** received their high school diploma in June 2018

NEW COLLABORATIONS

- Start of an Anglophone point-of-service at the Dawson Community Center, which has worked with 14 youths since September 2017. The project will continue next year with the goal of helping even more young people.
- In collaboration with the other Passeport pour ma réussite points of service, the Détour vers l'avenir career exploration and networking event was organized for about 60 youths from Quebec and the Ottawa region.

For 27 years, in collaboration with the Commission scolaire Marguerite-Bourgeoys, Toujours ensemble has served balanced and nutritious meals to students at the École Lévis-Sauvé and École Notre-Dame-de-Lourdes primary schools.

DURING THE 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR

- 11,800 meals served to 66 students from low-income families
- Educational and recreational activities held after each meal

IMPACTS

- Increased attention when students go back to class in the afternoon
- Increased awareness of healthy eating

"PAAS-ACTION" SOCIAL SUPPORT AND assistance program

Te participates in the social reintegration of adults who are having trouble accessing the job market. We welcomed, this past year, three people registered with Emploi-Québec's PAAS-Action program as kitchen helpers who support the school lunch service.



Christmas CAMPAIGN

At Te, the entire team works on the Christmas campaign for two months to create a memorable holiday for borough youths and families who may or may not participate in the organization's other activities. In total, **nearly 900 people** received support this year.

OVERVIEW

- **191 families** (539 people) received a Christmas basket with vegetables and meat.
- **25 sponsored families** (115 people) received a basket of food and personalized gifts.
- **20 families** (46 people) received a \$125 cheque from The Gazette Christmas Fund.
- 120 youths who attend our school lunch service received gifts from clients of the Mémé Tartine artisanal bakery and WeWork businesses.
- **55 youths** attended our Christmas party through the sponsorship project at La Fabrique Saint-Charles.

COLLABORATION WITH THE VERDUN OPTIMIST CLUB

VOLUNTEERS and TRAINEES

In 2017-2018, **115** volunteers shared Te's mission. Without a doubt, their involvement strengthens our impact in the community and helps spread our values of perseverance and sharing.

With the theme "Your actions, A+ in Their Success," this year's Hooked on School Days (HSD) were celebrated through theme activities. The team is proud that two Te youths, Alexia and Simon, were involved in the HSD national radio campaign.

SCOTIABANK CHARITY CHALLENGE

In April, Te took part in the Scotiabank Charity Challenge for a second year. The 2018 edition raised \$3,100 for the organization's activities. About 50 youths, donors, volunteers, friends and employees ran the 5K, 10K and 21K circuits for the benefit of Te. A dozen youths in the "Toujours en forme" running club ran the 5K race.



Te's running club was created in November 2017 by Mélissa Langevin, a Student-Parent Support Worker. In addition to running once a week, the club also took part in the Montreal 5K underground run, the Choco-course 5K, the 5K of the École secondaire Monseigneur-Richard, the FitSpirit 5K, the Santa Shuffle, the Classique verdunoise, and the Grand Défi Lac-Saint-Louis.


